

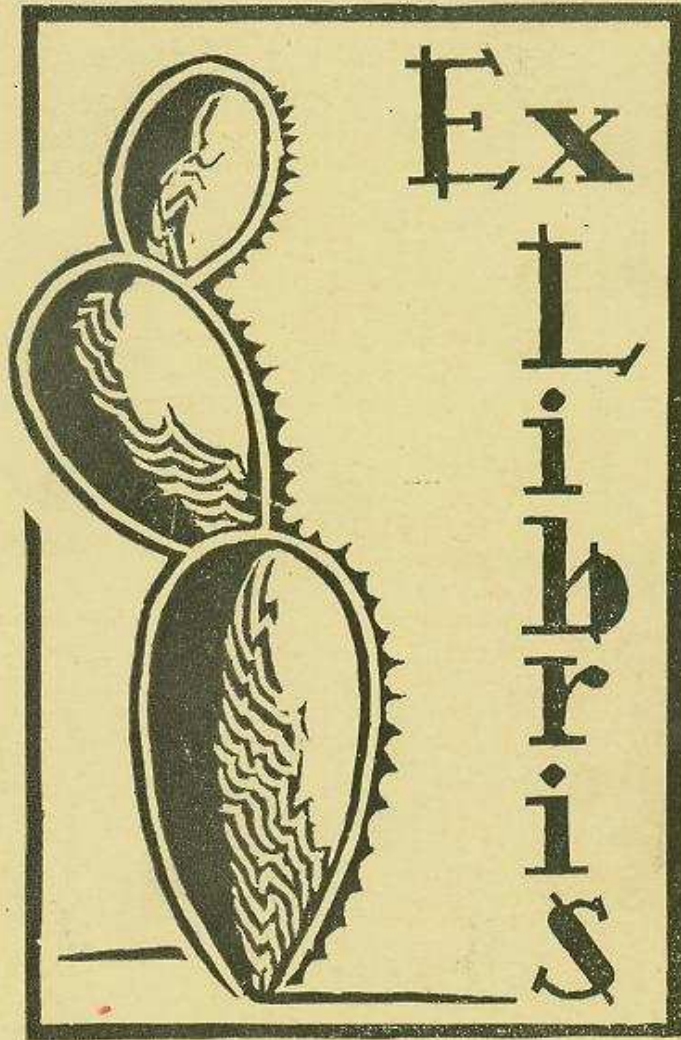

## ADMINISTRATORS

Mr. Kluss, who came to Grant from Waterloo in 1928, continued in his position of senior high principal after moving from Grant into our new six-year high school, in 1935. This position gives him the responsibility of administering the courses as set forth by the Board of Education. He also assigns teachers to their classes, supervises their instruction and that toward the pupils, secures needed supplies, and keeps the building conditions adequate. He supervises the registration, attendance, discipline, and choice of subjects of the students.

Mr. Kluss has made the statement, "The 1937-1938 year has been one of the most successful in making progress and achievement at Roosevelt."



Miss Zika was city supervisor of physical education from 1921 to 1929. The following year she became the Grant High dean of girls. Transferred to the new building, Roosevelt, she has continued in this position. She has charge of the clubs and social calendar and N. Y. A. work. All 10B girls are interviewed and helped by her, as are the 12A girls in regard to colleges or positions after leaving school. She is also the sponsor of the Tri-Blue Girl Reserve Club.



After graduating from Grant, Sara Slutsky worked as a stenographer at Wilson, Hayes, and the Board of Education. In 1931 she was transferred to Grant, coming to Roosevelt in 1935 with the advent of the new six-year high school system. As secretary to Mr. Kluss she carries out his instructions. She is accredited with the high accuracy of records, typing, mimeographing, and the accounting of the student activities fund.

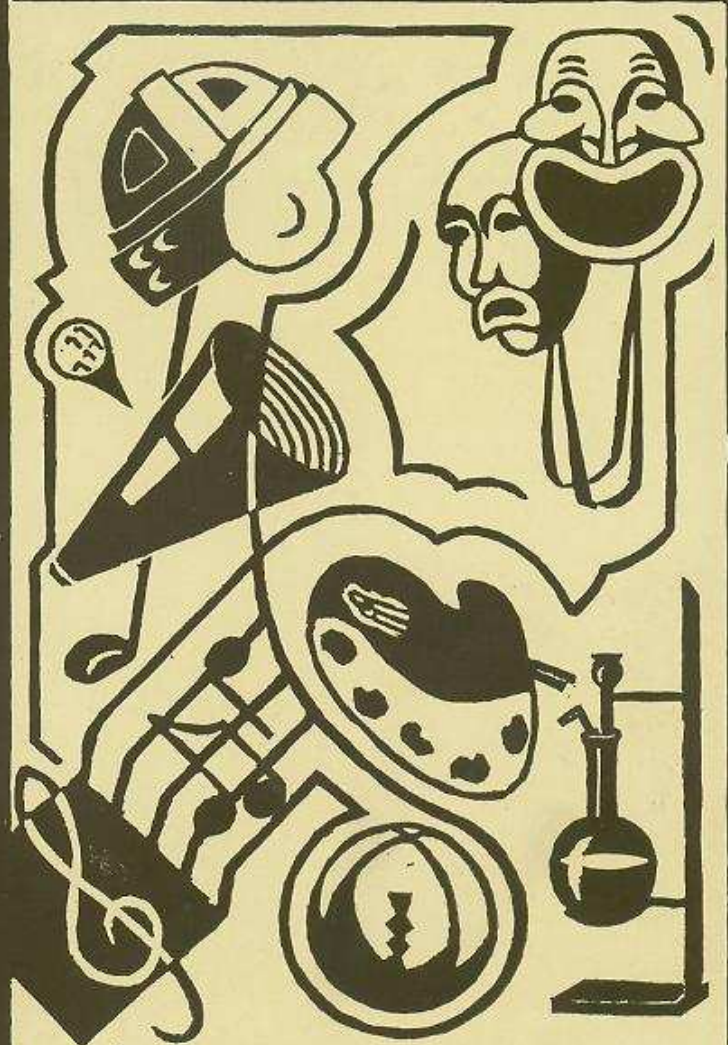

1937 — FOOTBALL — 1937

With several sophomores in the lineup, and with Wiley, Cocayne, Hammill, Linkletter and Schuknecht, '36 veterans, the Roosevelt team became a consistent threat in the latter part of the season.

The Roosevelt football team fared just as well this season in football competition as it did in the 1936 season. The team started the season with a squad of inexperienced players and lost the first three games to Davenport, West Waterloo, and Franklin without scoring a single point on their opponents. But with the experience of these three games the team scored its first touchdown against Dubuque, losing 28 to 6, and was not held scoreless in the next three games. The Riders then defeated McKinley 7 to 6 and Clinton 28 to 0, but in the annual Armistice Day clash with Wilson they could get nothing better than a tie, 7 to 7.

The outlook for a successful season in 1938 is bright.

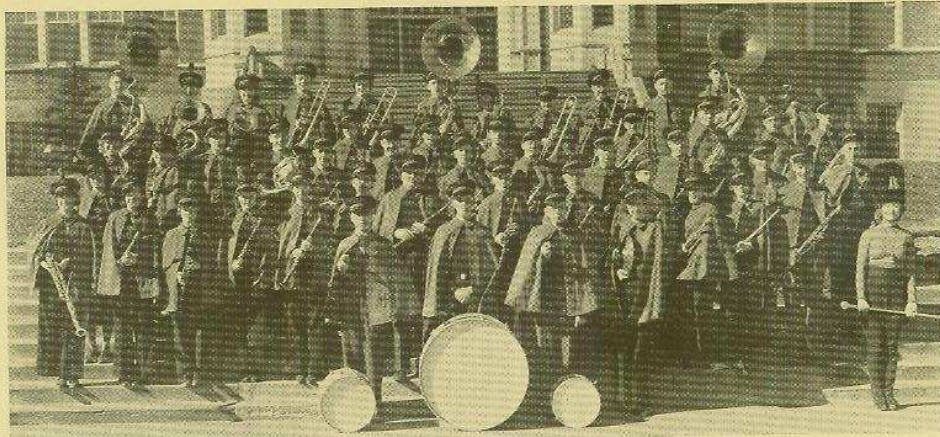
