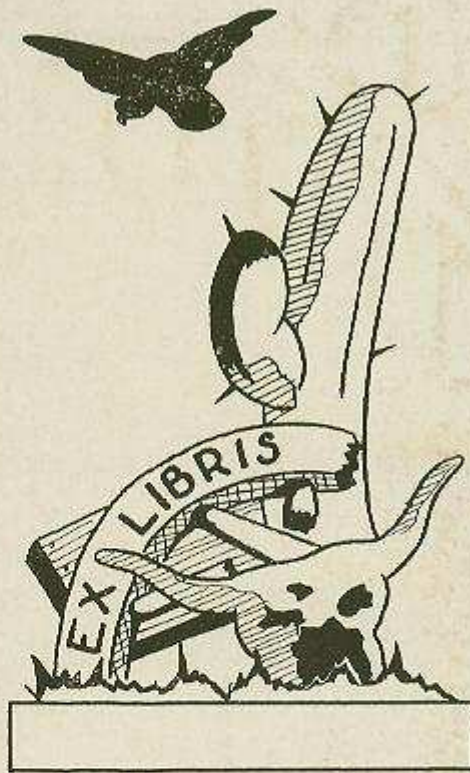

To the memory of Glenn A. Williams, Jr., a member of the June class of 1941 of Roosevelt High School, this Year Book is dedicated.



Glenn was an honor member of our class when he met his untimely death while he was doing what he liked best — playing football for Roosevelt. It was at West Waterloo on October 20, 1939, that he suffered his fatal injury. Prior to this, Glenn was Chaplain of Hi-Y, a member of the Rifle team and a representative in the Student Council for the second consecutive year. Because of his varsity football award won in 10B, he gained membership in the R Club. As he was being considered by many as a tackle on the 1939 all-state team, a prominent newspaper had taken his picture for publication. After his death, the Iowa Daily Press Association gave him special all-state recognition.

Each June, as a tribute to a typical Roughrider athlete, the school gives a "Glenn A. Williams Memorial Award" to the major letter winner who best exemplifies the traits of the boy whose name it bears.

To those who knew Glenn Williams, his fine character and his personality linger as a cherished memory.

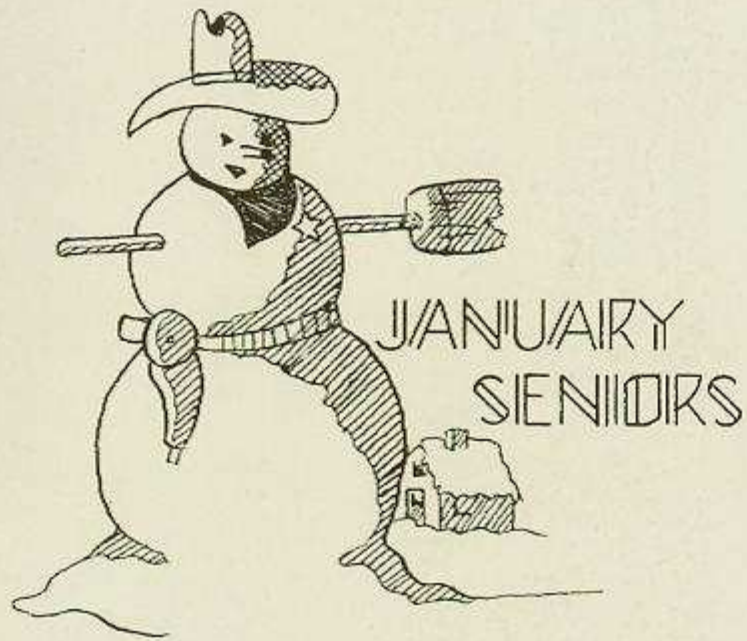

The team failed to win in its seven game schedule, but the stars still shone in the persons of Captain "Tony" Lehmkuel and Bob Hallquist who were the offensive guns in the backfield. De Lane Shaheen and Don Lehmkuel were chosen members of the Cedar Rapids Gazette's first all-city team.

Franklin high was victorious in the quest for the city championship and Daveapor emerged with the Mississippi Valley Conference title.

With but three letter winners, Emory Sample, Marvin Meels and Eugene Dorsey, from the '39-'40 varsity team returning, and the young '39-'40 sophomore squad, Coach Wolfe began forming the team. 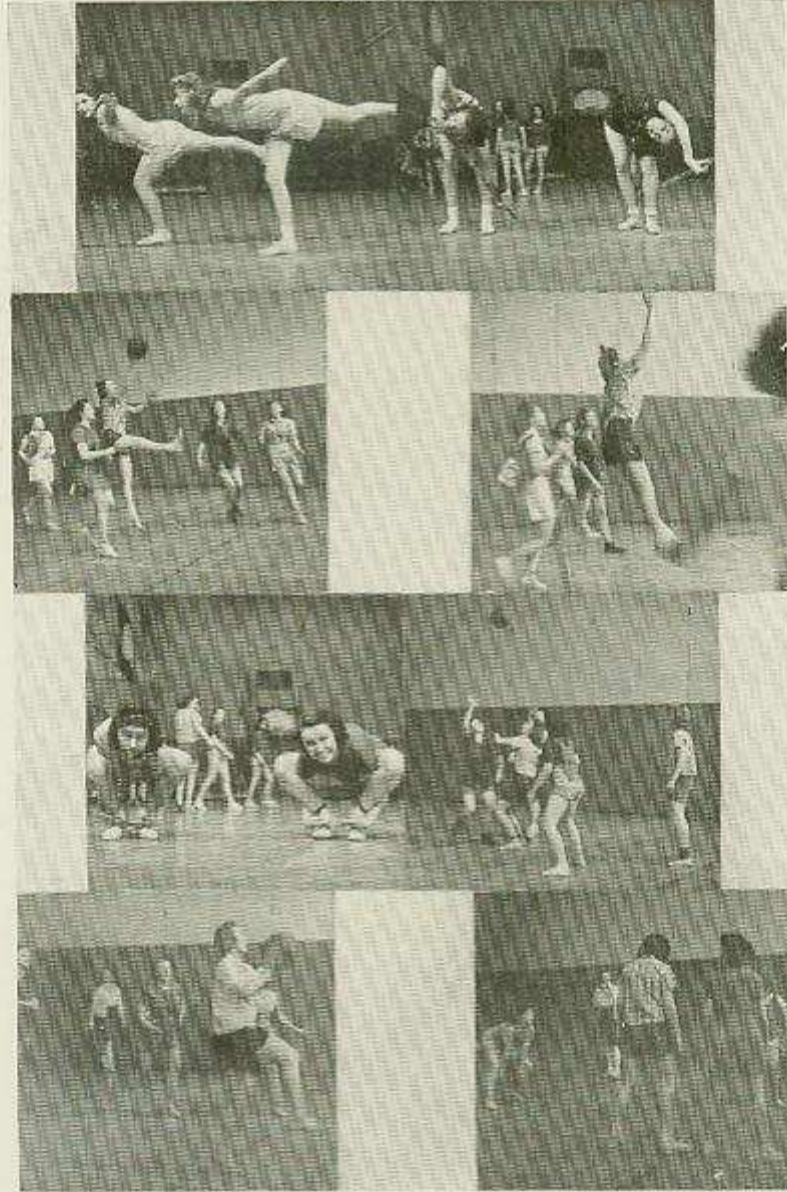

The "A" team, composed of Bob Hertel, Wilbur Collister, George Meyer, and Tod Neuhaus, was the school's entry in the state district meet at Waterloo.

The squad was coached by Harry K. Barnmeister.

CHOIR
