



VIRGINIA VANOUS

The following story appeared in the Record of January 19, 1942 regarding Virginia's untimely death. She was a member of the June Class of '43:

"Although in body, Virginia will no longer be near us, the memory of her will be permanently fixed in our hearts; know that even though the circumstances of her death were heart-rending and here on earth she was radiantly happy; she is comforted and enjoys a greater peace and is in the presence of God."

This was a portion of a tribute to Virginia Vanous, Roosevelt high school junior, who died Friday, January 9, 1942, from injuries received in an automobile accident, paid by the Rev. C. Hafley of the Four Square Tabernacle in the funeral service Monday, January 12, in the Beatty Chapel. Virginia was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Vanous of 835 F Avenue N. W. She is survived, in addition to her parents, by a sister, Patricia Vanous, an 8B student at Roosevelt.

Approximately three hundred of the eight hundred persons attending the funetal, were members of Roosevelt high school. Six students, Don Palmer, Gaylord Duval, Fred Bissell, Don Morgan, Emory Sample, and Fred Andrews, served as pall-bearers.
Floral pieces in the home included those sent by the student body, the homeroom class, and the Student Council.

"At eventide there shall be light." With this thought in mind a tribute was paid to Helen Johnson—popular senior—by Rev. A. L. McQuay at her funeral service Friday afternoon, March 19.

Helen, daughter of Mrs. Emma Johnson, 317 Third Street S. W., died Sunday, March 14, 1943, at the University hospital, Iowa City, following a brief illness.

In the Turner funeral chapel, where the services were held, her casket lay surrounded by huge banks of flowers, tangible evidence of the deep love and admiration Helen's friends and family bore for her. Many of her classmates attended the services and six girls served as honorary pallbearers. They were Violet Woodworth, Dorothy Peterson, Anna Thomsen, Nadine McManes, Mary Kluber, and Charlotte Zobin.

Helen entered Roosevelt in 1936 following her primary schooling at Taylor. She advanced with her class to 12A where she was active in school life. She was a member of Kappa Kappa Rho and Hi-Y-Ette. Daily, Helen concentrated on the school Red Cross work while previously she aided in completion of the service flag.

Throughout her life, "Johnnie," as her friends called her, was always dependable and found where she was most needed. As Rev. McQuay commented, "You always knew where to find her as she was always on the right side of every proposition."


