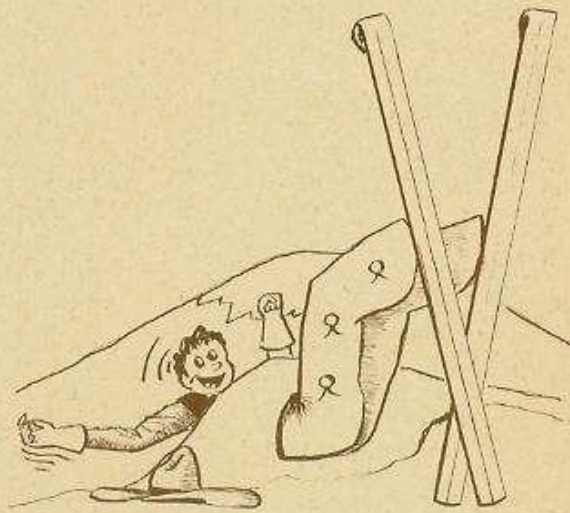
The sudden passing of one of our athletes, Bob Gray, came as a shock to all who knew him. It hardly seems possible that one who was so vivacious should be called in his youth.

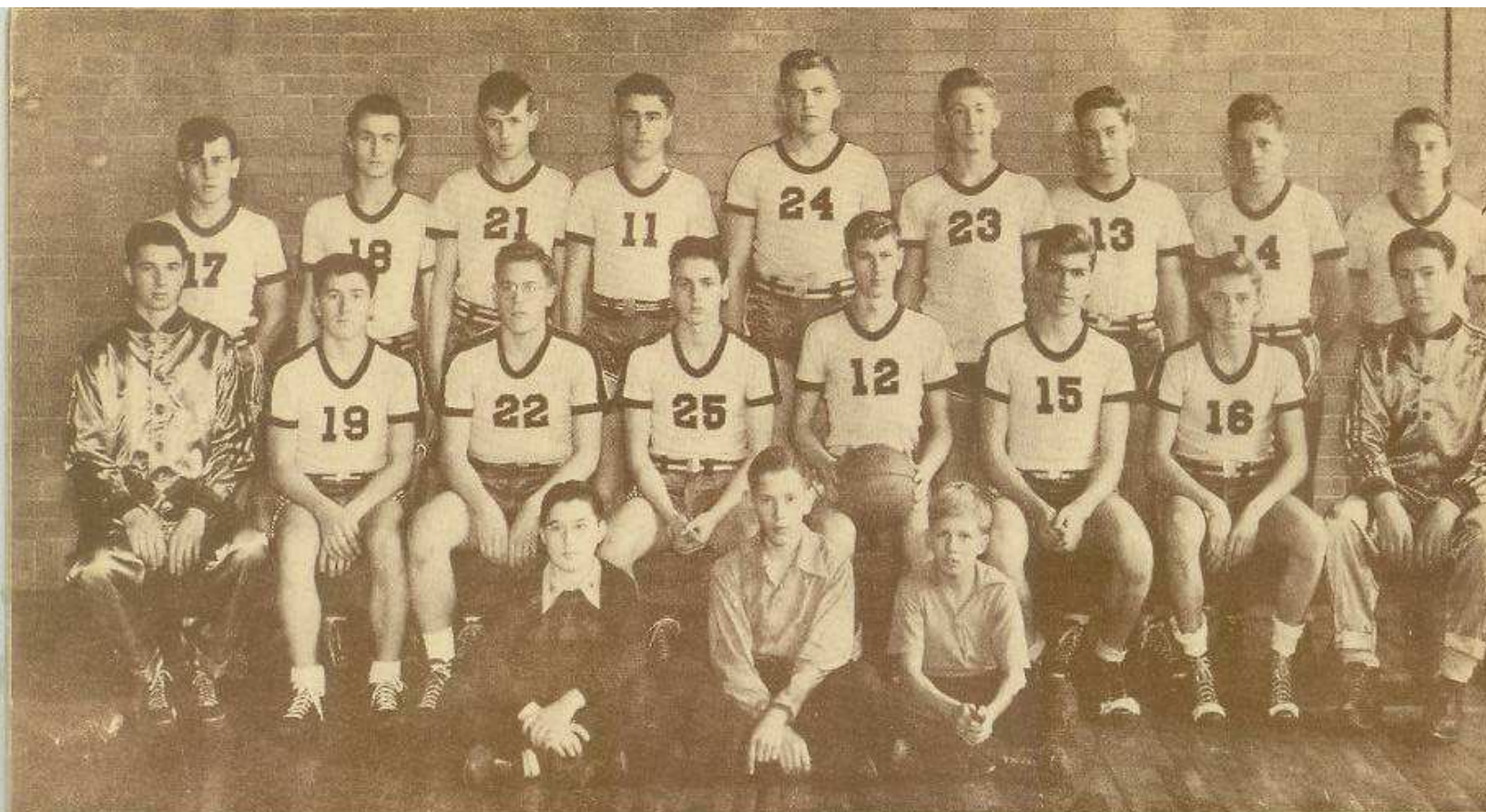

## BASKETBALL

Although the Roosevelt Roughriders had a lot of tough luck in the Mississippi Valley conference, they came back strong in the sectional and tournament to win from Marion and I. C.

**Marshalltown:** Teds opened season with a 28-42 loss with the Bobcats. Foushee was high man with 10 points.

**Clinton:** The scoring was much the same as that of the Marshalltown game, with the Teds losing 27-42. Foushee collected 11 points.

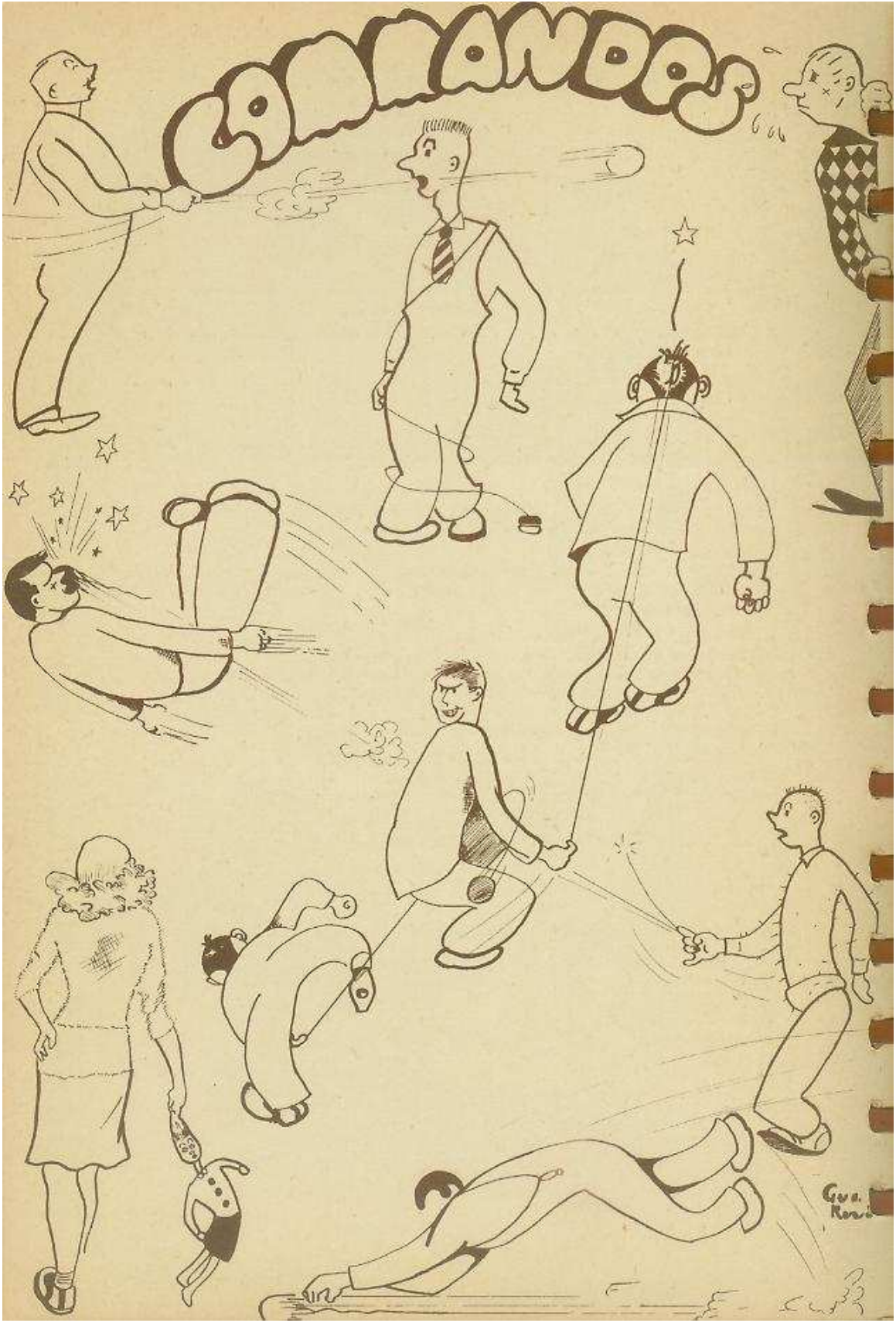
**Sectional:** Teds beat both Marion, 43-28, and I. C., 30-29, but lost to Franklin by a score of 9-40.

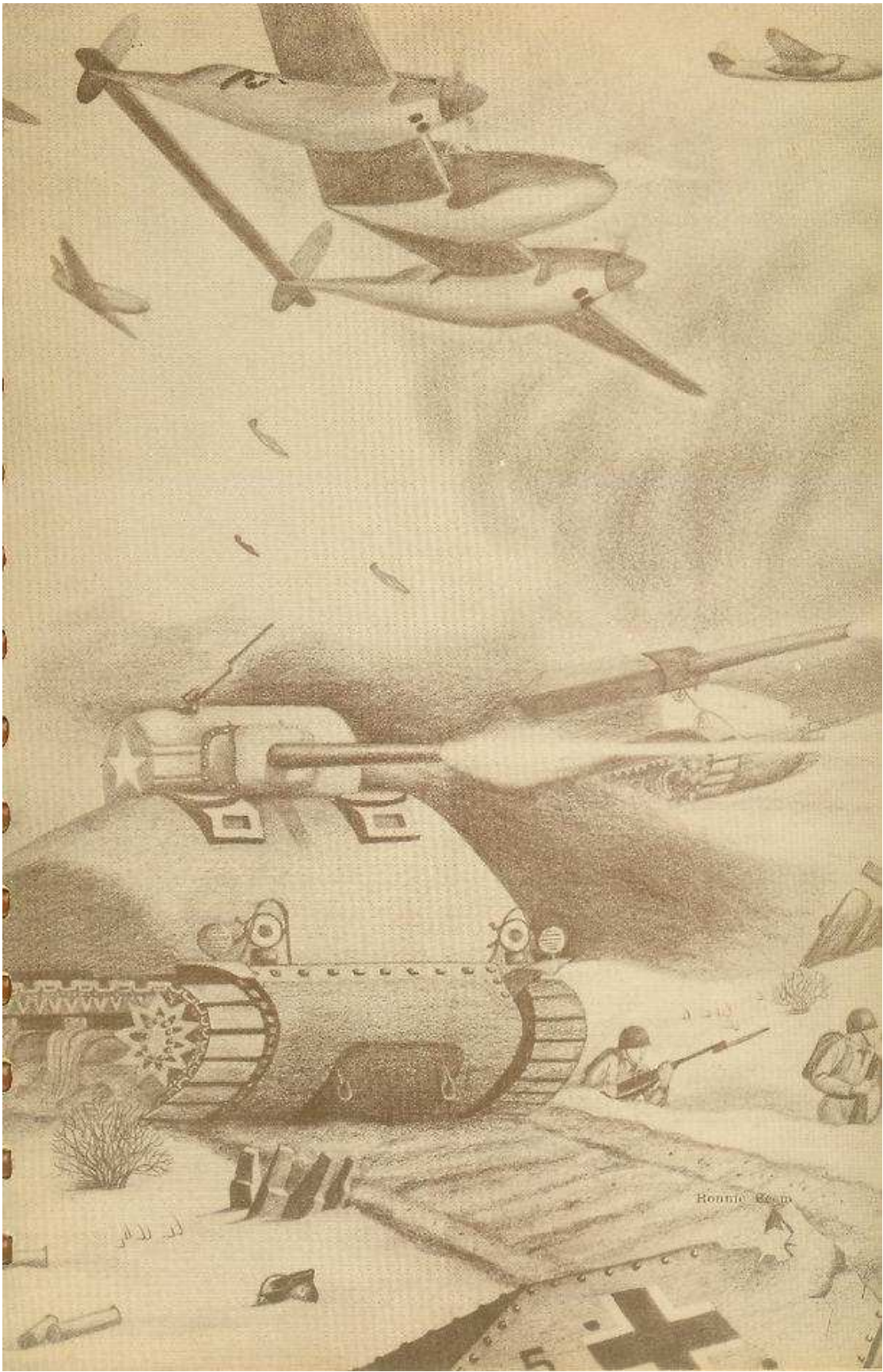
