

Franklin Guidelines for Success

In every area of our building we have well-defined and effective expectations. Whether students in are in a classroom, student lounge, cafeteria, or simply waiting for the school day to begin, students are taught the behavioral expectation for all common areas. The expectations were designed to be clear, age appropriate, detailed, reasonable, and used by both students and staff. Positive social behaviors are introduced, modeled, and reinforced and are an important part of a student's educational experience. To help students with meeting these behavior expectations we follow our Guidelines for Success.

Guidelines for Success represent a set of skills, traits, and attitudes that everyone in school always strive to demonstrate. Simply stated, these are our goals, lifelong learning strategies, or codes of conduct. This school-wide system was designed to help to create a safe, civil, and productive school.

Franklin Cellphone Policy

As technology continues to make life easier, and has done wonders for communication, it has also created more challenges. In a school setting it has created obstacles such as cheating and cyber bullying. Students struggle with appropriate cellphone use and tend to disrupt the learning environment with these items. Due to the many distractions a cellphone can create, students are required to turn cellphones off when entering the school building and keep them off during the school day. At the end of the school day when the student is leaving school, they may resume use. Under no circumstances are cellphones to be used in the restroom and locker-room areas. For parents or guardians needing to contact their child, please contact the school directly to make arrangements for messages to be given to their child.

First Offense:

If a student is caught using a cellphone during class time, it will be confiscated and brought to the office by the teacher. The student will be given a verbal warning and reminded of the cellphone policy. It will be logged by the main office secretaries. The student can pick up his or her cellphone at the end of the school day.

Second Offense:

If the cellphone is confiscated a 2nd time, it will be brought to the main office by the teacher and logged in by the main office secretaries. The student will be reminded of the cellphone policy and will receive a 30-minute detention. The student can pick up his or her cellphone at the end of the school day.

Third Offense:

If the cellphone is confiscated a 3rd time, it will be brought to the main office by the teacher and logged in by the main office secretaries. The student will be reminded of the cellphone policy, a support staff member will contact the parent/guardian, and the student will receive a 2 hour detention (i.e. 4 lunch detentions). The student can pick up his or her cellphone at the end of the school day.

Further Offenses:

Further offenses will be treated similar to the Third Offense above, in addition to making plans with the student and the parent/guardian to prevent further cellphone policy violations.

Franklin Middle School Dress Code Policy

Contacting Your Student(s)

If you need to contact your child during the day, <u>please call</u> the Attendance Office at 558-2162. We would prefer you do not contact them on their cellphone because of the disruption in the classroom and violation of our cellphone policy. If the student needs to leave early, we will contact the appropriate teacher and not release the student to anyone other than his/her parents unless we have your permission. This is protection for the child and an assurance to you. Any other message will be delivered to students in-between classes.

Items Delivered to Students

Items such as water bottles, keys, and instruments should be dropped off at the Attendance window inside the main entrance. The student will then be notified. Franklin will NOT accept any food deliveries from area restaurants placed by students or families. Parents may bring lunch to Franklin for their student, to be dropped off at the Attendance window. An office staff member will contact the student prior to their lunch time. Balloons/flowers for students may be delivered to the school but will be held in the Attendance office until the end of the school day for students to pick up.

Food Service

Franklin MS qualified for the Community Eligibility Provision grant (CEP) through the federal government. This grant allows all Franklin students to receive breakfast and lunch daily at no charge. Any extra items or entrees will be paid by the student. Please contact our Food and Nutrition department at 319-558-2305 with any questions regarding the CEP status. Breakfast is served in the North Cafeteria from 7:25 to 7:50, students should enter through door #7. Lunch will be served according to grades as listed in the schedule in this Handbook/Calendar.

Pictures

Barksdale Photo will provide us with photography services this year. This service enables all students to have a picture ID card and the opportunity for families to order school picture packets. Students will take their picture during school on Thursday, September 28th. There will be a Picture Make-Up day on November 9th (we do not do spring pictures). Replacement ID's throughout the school year can be requested from the Attendance Office.

Counselors

Each student is assigned a counselor but should feel free to consult with the other counselor if they find this desirable. Counselors are interested in helping each student in academic, social, and career development while at Franklin. The counselors will be available to work with you and your child in any way they can be of assistance.

Ms. Mann will work with all grades, last names beginning with A-L. Ms. Richmond will work with all grades, last names beginning with M-Z. A student may set up an appointment to

see their counselor by speaking with our Counseling Secretary, Ms. Burkle, before/after school or during passing time. A student MUST have a pass to come to the Counseling Office during class time. Parents may contact the Counseling Office during the school day at 319-558-2258.

Infinite Campus

In order to provide parents with student information, the Cedar Rapids Community School District requests all parent/guardians set up a parent account thru Infinite Campus. By setting up this account in the Parent Portal of Infinite Campus, parents will be able to access all their students' information from all schools regarding attendance, grades, mailing information, and emergency contacts. If you need assistance with the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, please contact our Counseling Office at 558-2258.

Google Classroom

Google Classroom is the platform teachers use to communicate or assign the following: publishing classroom messages/upcoming assignments/due dates, assigning classwork/homework/projects, and administering classroom polls/quizzes/tests. Students will have access to a Google Classroom in all their classes. Parents can also be invited to their student's Google Classroom to monitor student progress and assignment completion.

Visitors and Guests

The Cedar Rapids Community School District is using the Raptor Visitor and Volunteer Management System in our schools to strengthen our district's program of campus safety for students and faculty. Part of keeping students and faculty safe is knowing who is in our buildings at all times, and the Raptor system allows us to do that. The Raptor system tracks visitors, contractors, and volunteers in our schools and provides us with a safer environment for our students and staff.

Upon entering a district building, visitors will be asked to present an ID, which may be scanned or manually entered into the system. We understand that a parent or guardian, for a number of reasons, may not have a US government-issued ID. In this case, the school staff member can ask to see another form of identification and manually enter the person's name into the Raptor system. The system is designed to check this information against the sex offender registry. The Raptor system will check to ensure that registered sexual offenders are not entering our buildings.

- The Raptor system ONLY checks the visitor's name and date of birth for comparison with a national database of registered sex offenders.
- No other data from the ID is gathered or recorded.
- The system is NOT connected to any other database such as the Department of Motor Vehicles, and information is not shared with any outside agency.

Once entry is approved, Raptor will issue a badge that identifies the visitor, the date, and the purpose of his/her visit. A visitor's badge will not be necessary for those who visit our schools simply to drop off an item or pick up paperwork. If a person does not have identification, he/she can still be given access

to the building but will be escorted by a school staff member. The safety of our students is our highest priority and the Raptor visitor management system provides a consistent way to aid in keeping away people who may present a danger to our students. Thank you, in advance, for your understanding and support of enhancing school safety protocols in our district.

Health Services

The primary objective of the District's school health services program is to enhance the educational process of the student. The health services department includes: a health services manager, school nurses, and health secretaries. Working as a team, they assist students to reach optimum health, enabling them to achieve their fullest potential.

The school should be informed of students' significant health conditions. This information should be provided thru the Parent Portal in Infinite Campus. If the student's condition requires special adjustments in the school environment, the school nurse or school's health secretary should be contacted directly at 558-2076.

If a student begins to feel ill during the school day, they may be excused to go to the health office (clinic). Our school nurse or health secretary will evaluate the student and will contact the parents if the need is required.

Students should not call parents directly on their cellphone to leave school. For their safety, we ask all students to go to the clinic first. We ask for your cooperation so all appropriate school staff are informed of the student leaving.

Testing Services

Annually each child is required to take the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). The results of these tests are used in many different ways.

- 1. They provide you and your child information about academic progress.
- 2. They provide individual teachers and teams an opportunity to evaluate how successful they have been in helping the students under their direction.
- 3. They provide individual teachers and teams an opportunity to evaluate areas of growth for students and how to re-teach and/or modify their content lesson planning.
- 4. They provide the school and district administration with the results we must have to know if the type of education we are providing is resulting in successful academic growth for your children.
- 5. The results of tests may be used by counselors and teachers to assess learning difficulties and areas of strength; and in conference with your child, to help plan an educational program to meet his individual needs.

Throughout the year, students will also take *Benchmark Assessments* in the areas of Reading & Math. These assessments will be taken during their appropriate class multiple times throughout the year. Assessments will be administered through an online assessment titled iReady. Student performance on diagnostics will be communicated to families during conferences and through emails and mailings.

Progress Reporting

Progress reports are available to parents and students at the conclusion of each reporting period. Reports will be mailed out to families at the end of each semester. We urge you to attend conferences and go over progress reports with your child; check the attendance record and remarks to make sure the child understands what these mean. If you ever have questions regarding the reports, do not hesitate to call or email the individual teacher for an explanation. It is our desire to keep you informed of your child's progress at Franklin Middle School. All academic and attendance information is available through the Parent Portal in Infinite Campus.

Lost and Found

The school is not responsible for students' lost or stolen possessions; however, we try to help students locate their missing items. To help prevent items from getting lost in the first place:

- DO NOT bring articles of value to school, unless absolutely necessary
- MARK all clothing with student's name in permanent marker
- NEVER share your locker combination with ANYONE!

If an item turns out to be lost:

- The Lost and Found collection receptacles are located in the Attendance and P.E. Offices
- Report any stolen item to the main office immediately

Unclaimed items will be donated to charity at the end of each quarter.

Fees

The fee schedule as adopted by the Board of Education as follows:

This fee includes the use of the student's assigned Chromebook, classroom textbooks, electronic textbooks, and supplementary instructional materials and must be paid if your child is to receive the benefit of these programs. The Book Fees may be paid at the Main Office by exact cash, check, or money order. Credit cards are not accepted at the school. If you find it a

hardship to pay the fee in the beginning of the school year, you may arrange for a payment plan by calling the Principal's secretary at 558-2452. In the event your check is returned, it will be represented electronically along with the state fee.

To qualify for fee forgiveness or reduction, you must be approved for the free/reduced benefit thru the completion of the Financial Benefit Survey AND have completed the Release Agreements section in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

Activities Philosophy

- 1. Early adolescence is a time for exploration and experimentation rather than for athletic specialization. To this end, the Cedar Rapids program is scheduled and staffed to allow young people to select several sports consecutively in grades seven and eight. We have attempted, and will continue to attempt, to produce schedules which avoid unnecessary overlap of seasons in all middle school sports programs.
- 2. Broad participation, including games or contest participation by all squad members, is an essential element of an athletic program for early adolescents. To achieve this, practice time must be protected even for the least proficient athletes, and reserve games must be scheduled when squad sizes are large. Squad cutting has been and will continue to be prohibited.
- 3. The winning of athletic contests is not as important an aspect of our program as the development of skills, physical conditioning, leadership, sportsmanship, competitive spirit, pride, dedication and teamwork. Trying to win is important. Wanting to win is important. But the winning of contests at the expense of the more important aspects of sports development is not acceptable.

Attendance Policies

It is important that a student display regular and punctual attendance in order to have a successful career during the middle school years. The habits developed during these years often carry over to high school and beyond. Because of this, it is important that schools expect consistent attendance and take appropriate action if these expectations are not met.

Absences:

- 1. The following are valid reasons for absences:
 - Illness
 - Bereavement
 - School Activities

The following require prior notice:

- Professional Appointments
- Religious Observance
- Court Summons
- Prearranged Family Activities
- 2. All absences and tardies must be reported to the school by the parent/guardian via a phone call or email. Voicemail will take messages outside of regular school hours or when the Attendance secretary is unable to answer directly. If an absence occurs and parents have not called, the Attendance Office will contact the parents.
- 3. If your student is absent from school, classwork may be accessed from the student's Google Classrooms. Please contact your student's teacher directly either by phone or email, with any questions regarding missed work. Advanced notice is required if parents are requesting to pick up classwork materials.

Absent From School

Please call the Attendance Office at 558-2162, the day your child is absent. Students are permitted to leave school only when:

- a. Parent/guardians call the Attendance Office notifying staff that the student is to leave. Please contact the office a minimum of 1 hour prior to the student leaving unless it is an emergency.
- b. Illness occurs and the Health Office contacts the parent/guardian.

Late To School

Any student arriving to school after 7:50 AM must report to the Attendance window inside the main doors. Parent/guardians need to call to report the reason for the tardy. The student will receive a tardy pass to enter their classroom. Excessive tardies may result in disciplinary action.

Learner Centered Assessment

Franklin uses Learner Centered Assessment (LCA) to plan, instruct, and assess student performance. The information below provides families important notes on how LCA will be used throughout the student's day.

Guidelines for Classroom Implementation

- 1. **Final Performance Level** The final mark will be determined by the performance on reporting standards only, not every standard.
- Practice/Assessment Practice is used to support the learning of the standard, it is not used to measure proficiency. Performance on practice will be recorded in the gradebook but will not count towards the final performance level.

The following are examples of practice and assessment.

- Practice: classwork, homework, activities, project, discussion, presentation
- Assessment: project, presentation, assessment (any measure that reflects the attainments of the standard proficiency)
- 3. Retakes- Students will earn the retake through a process that could include further study of the material, required after school sessions, completion of all the practice work assigned for the unit, or other identified time between the teacher and student. The procedures for retakes will vary based upon the standard and the class. Successful completion of the retake will receive full credit.
- 4. **Multiple Opportunities –** Students will have a minimum of three opportunities to demonstrate proficiency on a standard taught during that reporting period.
 - a. The final proficiency levels will be calculated based on the 3 most recent performance levels for the standard.

Commonly used terms for Learner Centered Assessment


Standard- Content specific knowledge/skills that students should know and be able to do in each subject area.

Assessment - Any check of evidence of the level of student current knowledge and skill towards the standard.

Performance Level- The student's current level of understanding of a standard. (See image below and on the next page)

Reporting Period- This is a nine-week/quarter (Exploratory classes) when a snapshot of the performance of a student will be documented. Printouts will be provided halfway through the year and at the end of the year.

21st Century Skills- Non-academic skills such as work habits and character traits, that are required for the process of learning. Franklin's focus will be **RESPONSIBILITY**. 21st Century Skills will be assessed in every class and reported out.





Chapter 102 -Reporting Child Abuse

Chapter 102 of the Iowa Administrative Code establishes procedures for investigating incidents of abuse of students by school employees. The procedures include the designation of investigators for the 2022-2023 School Year. The following are the designated Level I investigators for the CRCSD. Any of the following persons may serve as an investigator.

Any person may file a Level I complaint against a Cedar Rapids Community School District employee by completing a Level I complaint form and turning it in to his/her building principal. Special Diet Requests

STUDENT HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Student Illness or Injury During the School Day

Students are sent to the health office if they are injured or appear ill. Health office staff will attend to the student's complaint. This may include providing first aid, asking the student questions about how he/she feels, taking a temperature, making observations, talking to the teacher, and contacting the school nurse.

Students will be sent home for:

- A temperature of 100.4° F. or higher
- Active, illness related vomiting or diarrhea

The parent/guardian will be called and the student will be sent home. Other symptoms that influence the decision to send the student home include general appearance and functioning in the classroom.

After a period of observation a decision will be made to do one of the following:

- Notify the parent/guardian for symptoms of illness or injury of a serious nature as determined by the school nurse and/or health secretary. Not all student visits to the health office will result in parents/guardians being contacted.
- Allow the student to rest in the health office for a brief period then return to class.

Students are to be fever-free without fever reducing medication before returning to school. During times of high rates of illness, such as during influenza season, the length of time a student must remain home after fever/symptoms of illness may change as recommended by Linn County Public Health.
