## 6<sup>th</sup> Overall Comprehension Performance

• By the end of the year, students will read and comprehend at increasing Lexile difficulty.

## 6<sup>th</sup>Main Idea and Determining Details

## Unit: "New Americans"

- Students will differentiate between a topic, main idea, and detail.
- Students will understand the connection between the main idea and details.
- Students will identify the topic of a passage and create applicable main idea statements.
- Students will understand that details need to specifically connect to the main idea statements.
- Students will differentiate between essential details and trivial details.
- Students will identify when a statement is too broad or too narrow when given a multiplechoice question.

# 6<sup>th</sup> Sequencing Unit: "When Disaster Strikes"

- Students will recognize that sequencing is placing events in chronological order.
- Students will identify sequencing signal words.
- Students will self-monitor their list of sequential events for accuracy and logical order.
- Students will realize that when sequencing events in the plot may take place simultaneously.
- When given a passage, students will place the events in chronological order.

# 6<sup>th</sup>Elements of Literature Unit: "Identity Crisis"

<u>Setting</u>

- Students will identify when a story takes place.
- Students will identify where a story takes place.
- Students will distinguish changes in setting (time and place).

Character

- Students will differentiate between the main character(s) and the supporting characters.
- Students will use specific examples from the passage to determine appropriate character traits.
- Students will analyze how characters grow and change in a passage.

# 6<sup>th</sup> Elements of Literature Unit: "Identity Crisis"

<u>Plot</u>

- Students will realize that every fictional passage has a problem that needs to be solved.
- Students will recognize that plot is the overlying sequence of events in a passage.
- Students will identify the key events from the beginning, middle, and end of the story.

## Theme

- Students will understand that theme is the message about life the author wants the reader to take away from the passage.
- Students will infer from the title, character's action, and plot to identify the theme of a passage.

## **Continued 6<sup>th</sup> Summarizing**

#### Unit: "Stolen Childhoods"

- Students will understand summarizing as a process of identifying the topic and key details of a passage to demonstrate comprehension.
- Students will differentiate between essential details and trivial details in a passage.
- Students will use elements of literature to summarize the text.
- Students will incorporate the topic and key details of a passage in a short oral or written summary.

## 6<sup>th</sup> Problem and Solution

#### Unit: "Under Pressure"

- Students will identify the problem (conflict) in a passage.
- Students will recognize the different attempts for problem solving in a passage. Students will comprehend there may be multiple solutions to a single problem in a passage.
- Students will realize not all problems have a clear solution in a passage.

# 6<sup>th</sup> Vocabulary

## All Units

- Given a word used in context, students will identify a synonym from a list of given words.
- Given a word used in context, students will identify an antonym from a list of given words.
- Students will be able to comprehend the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text (including figurative and connotative meanings).
- Students will determine and clarify the meaning of unknown and multiple meaning words and phrases.
- Students will acquire and use accurately grade-appropriate general academic words and phrases.
- From the unit's target words, students will appropriately write a sentence incorporating a given term.

# 6<sup>th</sup>Writing

# All Units/Individual Novel Worksheets

- When asked to respond to a passage, students will formulate a response with:
  - o a topic sentence which includes a restatement of the question.
  - o details that go beyond the obvious.
  - o correct sentence structure, grammar, and punctuation.
  - o concluding sentences as needed.
- Students will make connections between their own lives and texts using the text/self, text/text, text/world, and text/character strategy.

## 6<sup>th</sup>Speaking and Listening

- Students will engage in class discussions.
- Students will build on other's ideas.
- Students will express their own ideas clearly with respect to the speaking situation.
