SAFETY CONCERNS

Cedar Rapids Community School District takes your safety seriously and welcomes your input. Please contact your building principal/administrator and report any safety concerns that you may have. Thank you for helping us keep staff and students safe.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

State Law requires that every student must have emergency contact information on file with their school. You can enter this information through e-verification. Once you enter your information, it becomes available to Taft through Infinite Campus.

If you do not have access to a computer, we will have computers available for you to come in and use. Please call 558-2243 to set up a time to come into the main office for assistance.

"The Board believes inappropriate student appearance causes material and substantial disruption to the school environment or presents a threat to the health and safety of students, employees and visitors. Students are expected to adhere to standards of cleanliness and dress that are compatible with the requirements of a good learning environment. The standards will be those generally acceptable to the community as appropriate in a school setting. When, in the judgment of the principal, a student's appearance or mode of dress disrupts the educational process or constitutes a threat to health



or safety, the student may be required to make modifications or be subject to disciplinary action."

- School Board Regulation 603.1

The following items have been determined to be disruptive to the educational process at Taft and should **<u>not</u>** be worn:

- Clothing that reveals undergarments
- Bandanas, hats, or any other head coverings (unless for specific religious convictions) between 7:50-2:50
- Hoods should be down between 7:50-2:50
- T-shirts with suggestive or inappropriate messages such as ads for tobacco, liquor, bars, drugs, weapons, or gangs
- Very short skirts or shorts
- · Low-cut, halter tops, or extreme crop tops
- Volleyball-style spandex shorts
- Sunglasses
- Slippers
- Costumes
- Large headphones or earbuds should only be worn when needed in the classroom and should only be used for instructional purposes

Other attire may be deemed inappropriate for school if it contributes to the disruption of the educational process at Taft.

STUDENT FEE WAIVER

Students whose families meet the income guidelines for free and reduced price lunch, the Family Investment Program (FIP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), transportation assistance under open enrollment, or who are in foster care are eligible to have their student fees waive or partially waived. *This waiver does not carry over from year to year. Parents and/or students who may qualify will need to register for this waiver in Infinite Campus under Release Agreements in E-Verification. E-Verification is listed on Taft's website under "Quicklinks" and then click on Infinite Campus. If you need assistance contact the Taft main office at 319-558-2243, option 3.



All students will be issued ID cards at the beginning of the year and they are expected to bring them to school daily. ID cards are needed for school bus transportation. Bent, damaged, or lost ID cards can be replaced through the counseling office for a fee of \$5.00 to be paid by students or billed to parents.



CELL PHONES AND OTHER TECHNOLOGY

Cell phones can be a useful tool for keeping children in contact with their parents, reducing communication lapses, and ensuring student safety to and from school. If used inappropriately, they can also be very disruptive to the learning environment. Taft developed the following cell policy in order to help students learn appropriate cell phone use.

Students must have cell phones turned off and in their lockers from 7:50-2:50 in order to protect instructional time. Cell phone use outside of this timeframe is not permitted. This allows students to communicate with parents to arrange rides, etc. but also protects the important instructional time of the school day. This time restriction is non-negotiable with students. If a student absolutely needs to call a parent during the school day, the student may ask to use a teacher's classroom phone. There is a bountiful supply of teacher phones in the building, so there is no reason for students to have their cell phone from 7:50-2:50.

No videotaping or photography is allowed at Taft without staff approval.



YOUR FAMILY CAN HELP SUPPORT TAFT HY-VEE CASH 4 STUDENTS

With this program, Hy-Vee receipts equal funds for Taft!

Accumulate your Hy-Vee receipts and drop them off at the Attendance Window.

Hy-Vee will award our school \$1.00 for every \$200.00 worth of receipts. *Receipts may be from April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025.

Last school year Taft earned around \$1000.00. The check was submitted to the PTA in early June.

STUDENT SUPERVISION AFTER SCHOOL

Middle school students are dismissed at 2:50 p.m. daily. Please take notice that by 3:10 p.m. all middle school students MUST be out of the building and off campus unless under the direct supervision of a staff member. Relieving staff supervising students from 3:15 until their workday ends at 3:30 allows our professional staff to have time to work with students one-on-one, prepare lessons, and attend committee, building, and district meetings.

Please make some kind of arrangement for your child after school. Parental responsibility begins at 2:50 when students are dismissed from school. If you cannot pick up your child until 3:10 p.m. or later, please make other arrangements.

We would never jeopardize the health or safety of any students. For these reasons, you can be sure we will allow students to stay inside during inclement weather if they are awaiting a ride after 3:10 p.m.

Social Emotional Behavioral Learning

We can all agree that character building is an important part of growing up. At Taft, we are not only dedicated to building the academic skills of every student, but we are also dedicated to educating students in their social, emotional, and behavioral growth. The process by which we do this comes from direct instruction and practicing appropriate behaviors.

Caring School Community

During the school day, students will be engaged in the Caring School Community (CSC) curriculum where we work to build student's social skills through a variety of lessons, activities, and conversations. The goal of CSC is to build up every student's social and emotional IQ as they progress through their middle school years.

P.A.R.R.T.

Taft's students' expectations are summarized with the PARRT acronym that helps guide student behavior and school culture. Teachers model these expectations and practice them regularly with the students.

Personal Best - We strive for high quality products and outcomes.

Active Listening - We listen with our eyes, ears, hearts, and undivided attention.

Respect - We show tolerance and regard for people, property, and ideas.

Responsibility - We follow directions and procedures. We are dependable.

Trustworthiness - We are truthful, reliable, and choose to do the right thing.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Attendance at Taft

The Taft Attendance Committee works hard to help families remove any barriers that might prevent students from attending school. The committee consists of the School Counselors, Engagement Specialist, School Nurse, and the Attendance Secretary. We communicate with families about missed days and the importance of attendance to student academic success.

The average Cedar Rapids student misses no more than 5 days a year, and we would like to see that number drop for Taft students. Many of our students have perfect attendance or miss just one or two days throughout the school year.

ALISHA MALAMPHY


We are proud to announce that Alisha Malamphy will be changing her role at Taft. She will be Taft's new Associate Principal Secretary.

TAFT CLINIC INFORMATION

Cedar Rapids Community Schools promotes the belief that healthy students are better learners. Each school's health office is staffed by a school nurse and a health secretary. The school nurse has multiple building assignments and will visit each school at least once each week. They are available by pager for questions or consultation at all times. The health secretary is certified in CPR, First Aid and medication administration and is in the health office every day.

The school should be informed of a student's significant health condition. This information should be provided at the beginning of the school year on student(s) E Registration. The information will be shared with school staff that need to know about your child's condition. If the condition requires special adjustments in the school environment, the school nurse should be contacted. Any changes in student health status during the year should be communicated to the school nurse or health secretary.

Students are sent to the health office if they are injured or appear ill. Depending on the student's need, their temperature may be taken. If the student has a temperature that is 100.4 degrees F. or over, the parent/guardian will be called and the student will be sent home. The student may return to school when they have been fever free, without the assistance of medicine. Temperature is not the only symptom that influences the decision to send the student home; general appearance and functioning are also important factors.

After a period of observation, a decision will be made to do one of the following:

- Call the parent/guardian
- Allow the student to rest in the health office for a brief period
- Return the student to class
- Parents will also be notified of injuries, which appear to require close observation or
- medical attention.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL INCOMING 7TH GRADE STUDENTS

<u>1 dose of Meningococcal vaccine -r</u>eceived on or after age 10. A booster dose will be needed at age 16.

<u>Proof of Tdap vaccine (tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis) booster vaccination</u> -has been required by the State for school attendance since 2013-14.

You may bring proof of Meningococcal &/or Tdap immunizations on the 1st day of school, or to the Taft Office at any time. They can also be faxed to Taft at 319-558-2661. *Students without proof of vaccination, or a state exemption, will not be allowed to at-

tend classes in the fall. Please check with your primary healthcare provider NOW about these two vaccines.

If you do not have a primary healthcare provider, please contact the school nurse (below) or CRCSD District Metro Care Connection clinics at 319-558-2481 or Linn County Public Health at 319-892-6000 for assistance.

METRO CARE CONNECTION

Metro Care Connection, Cedar Rapids Community School District's school-based health center, is available to provide free physicals during the school year. The clinic is open to any Taft student who is uninsured, underinsured, or has Medicaid. We really want to emphasize that student's with physicians and insurance need to be seeing their own health care providers for continuity of care.

The clinic will be staffed by a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to be present for the physical exams. If the parent/guardian is unable to be present, students under the age of 18 must have a completed consent form and medical history form signed by a parent/guardian in order to be examined. These forms can be accessed from the MCC website: http://mcc.cr.k12.ia.us/forms.html or by asking the activities office or health office at the school the student attends. Please call the MCC program office at 558-2481 for an appointment.


7-8 GRADE STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN ATHLETICS

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Medical Eligibility forms along with the concussion form are required to participate. Both forms must be signed by parent and athlete.



HELPFUL REMINDERS



Our students do well when they know school expectations and have parents and teachers to monitor their compliance. Please review the following with your student.

TO ENSURE SUCCESS

• Keep valuables at home. There is no reason to bring large amounts of money or expensive items to school.



- Adhere to Taft's "Cell Phones and Chromebook Policies"
- School is dismissed at 2:50. We expect students who are not involved in school related activities to leave school grounds immediately. If a student rides a bus, he/she is expected to get on the bus after school.
- Parents, please know when your student has completed his/her after school activity and be here on time to pick him/her up. This avoids the problems that occur when students are waiting unsupervised.
- Wear appropriate clothing that is consistent with a serious learning environment. Guidelines can be found in the Parent/Student Handbook. When in doubt, don't wear it and ask a teacher, counselor or administrator for an opinion.



• Review the definition of plagiarism. Plagiarism=Cheating. Using "cut and paste" from an Internet site and turning it in as original work is not the intent when teachers assign a report.

TAFT CAFETERIA BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAM

Breakfast is available on a daily basis for the 2024-2025 school year. Breakfast will be served from 7:20-7:40 am. The cost for breakfast is \$2.35.

All lunches are 30 minutes. The cost for lunch is \$3.40. Students may pay for additional lunch items on a daily basis (no bill bigger than \$5 please) or parents/guardians may add money to their student's accounts using the online accounting system called "cedarrapids.familyportal.cloud." This is located on the Taft homepage. Milk may be purchased for 60 cents per carton. Special ala carte selections may be purchased as an alternative to the regular hot lunch.


Free and Reduced Lunch
